MARRIAGE AND DATING

Our final advancement, for both young and old, is from our humanity to our inherent divinity.

Let there be education for ethical ideals and for spiritual values. If public agencies and social institutions do not provide it, the last recourse is for family upbringing to make up for its lack or its absence.

We can, more than ever, have great faith and trust in our youths. They face more challenges with their added opportunities. As parents we provide the support, encouragement and guidance that they need. Our community efforts can be a very healthy reinforcement. Our involvement is critical to success at all age levels. The busier we are, the more time may be called for to be with our youths, to be with their own problems and their positive possibilities.
